Notes to remember:

- ONB providers must complete a department background check pursuant to WAC 110-06. For more information online, go to http://apps.leg.wa.gov/wac/default.aspx?cite=110-06.
- ONB providers, including volunteers, must provide documentation signed within the last 12 months by a licensed health care professional of tuberculosis (TB) testing or treatment (see ONB Touchstone Standards 0105, section 3). For more information online, go to www.dcyf.wa.gov/sites/default/files/pdf/Outdoor_ Nature_Based_Child_Care_Touchstone_Standards.pdf.
- All providers must register with the electronic workforce registry (MERIT) before being granted a license or before working unsupervised with children.

Volunteer Training Requirements: Trainings listed in ONB Child Care Touchstone Standards 0106 sections 4-7 are included in School Age Basics. If a volunteer does not complete School Age Basics (which is not required for volunteers) a volunteer can complete these trainings as stand-alone trainings for free with DCYF online.

^{*}If already employed at the time this rule goes into effect, ONB Child Care Basics must be completed within three months of the date this section becomes effective. All new employees must have completed ONB Child Care Basics before working unsupervised with children.

In-Service Training Requirements

ONB Child Care Touchstone Standards 107

Notes to remember:

- ONB providers complete 10 hours of annual in-service training.
- In-service is required after 12 months of cumulative employment.
- The annual training requirement is based on the DCYF calendar year (January 1 – December 31).
- Five in-service training hours may be carried over from one calendar year to the next calendar year.
- "STARS hours" or "state-approved training" are other words commonly used when referring to "in-service."

State-approved training. Other training must align with the WA State Core Competencies. College coursework aligned with WA State Core Competencies.
