## Child Care in

# **Washington State**



April 2022

In most parts of Washington, the number of child care providers declined from 2008-2013, becoming more stable from 2014-2020 although still in decline at a lesser rate. Capacity for children declined from 2008-2013, however due to more family child care closures than center-based care, capacity has risen from 2014-2019. Since the pandemic there has been a net loss of nearly 150 providers and around 1,500 slots. This decline has disproportionately impacted communities based on location. In the net loss of providers, nearly 40% are center-based, representing 60% of the capacity lost.





In Washington State, the number of child care providers has dropped from 5,488 with capacity for 169,464 children in 2017, to 5,211 providers with capacity for 183,816 children in December of 2021.\*





## **Early Achievers**

Early Achievers is Washington's Quality Rating and Improvement System (QRIS), which gives training, technical assistance, coaching, awards, scholarships, and other benefits to child care providers to improve the quality of their care.

#### Statewide, 3,926 child care providers participate in Early Achievers.

Approximately 71% of licensed child care providers in WA are enrolled in Early Achievers, serving 73,000 children\*. Early Achievers provides families with valuable child care program quality rating information so they can make informed child care choices.


