EXPLANATORY NOTES

AGREEMENT

- 1. This NATO Standardization Agreement (STANAG) is promulgated by the Chairman MAS under the authority vested in him by the NATO Military Committee.
- 2. No departure may be made from the agreement without consultation with the tasking authority. Nations may propose changes at any time to the tasking authority where they will be processed in the same manner as the original agreement.
- 3. Ratifying nations have agreed that national orders, manuals and instructions implementing this STANAG will include a reference to the STANAG number for purposes of identification.

DEFINITIONS

- 4. <u>Ratification</u> is "In NATO Standardization, the fulfilment by which a member nation formally accepts, with or without reservation, the content of a Standardization Agreement" (AAP-6).
- 5. <u>Implementation</u> is "In NATO Standardization, the fulfilment by a member nation of its obligations as specified in a Standardization Agreement" (AAP-6).
- 6. <u>Reservation</u> is "In NATO Standardization, the stated qualification by a member nation that describes the part of a Standardization Agreement that it will not implement or will implement only with limitations" (AAP-6).

RATIFICATION, IMPLEMENTATION AND RESERVATIONS

7. Page iii gives the details of ratification and implementation of this agreement. If no details are shown it signifies that the nation has not yet notified the tasking authority of its intentions. Page iv (and subsequent) gives details of reservations and proprietary rights that have been stated.

Interchangeability of NATO Indirect Fire

Ammunition

AIM

1. The aim of this agreement is to standardise key technical data for those artillery and mortar systems and their ammunition which are currently in-service with NATO members. This STANAG supports STANAG 4425 in enabling assessment to be made of the degree of interchangeability existing between artillery and mortar system components by a comparison of form and fit.

AGREEMENT

2. Participating nations agree to adopt the NATO approved data listed in AEP-35 for use in assessing the degree of interchangeability between current and future indirect fire systems and when reporting on such interchangeability to other NATO nations.

FUTURE DEVELOPMENT OF AEP-35

3. This STANAG authorises future changes to the data listed in AEP-35 and to the content of the various chapters. Such changes can be made without resubmitting this parent STANAG for ratification but must be approved unanimously in plenary session by a group appointed by the NAAG as custodian of the STANAG and its associated AEP-35. At the time of submission of this STANAG for ratification, that group was Sub-Panel 2 of AC/225-Panel IV.

IMPLEMENTATION OF THE STANAG

4. This STANAG shall be considered to be implemented when a nation has issued instructions that the data listed in AEP-35 shall be used in all assessment of interchangeability of indirect fire systems.
