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### GLOBAL NAVIGATION SATELLITE SYSTEMS (GNSS) INTERFACE CONTROL DOCUMENT (ICD) CAPABILITY TEAM MANDATE

### 1. SCOPE

1.1. This work is part of the following C3 Board Lines of Development Capability (Reference A):

1.1.1. Line of Development 10 - Positioning Navigation and Timing (PNT): To improve operational effectiveness through interoperable and guaranteed access for NATO and Allies to precise and trusted PNT services

1.1.2. Line of Development 4: Interoperability Standards and Profiles: Primary source of profile and standards to achieve repeatable Alliance C3 interoperability and technical coherence.

### 2. MISSION

2.1. The C3 Board has agreed the standardization proposal to develop a Standardisation Agreement (STANAG) for Open Systems Architecture standards for the data Interface Control Documents (ICDs) associated with **open signals** GNSS receivers.

2.2. Under the direction of the NATO C3 Board (C3B), Navigation and Identification Capability Panel (NAVID Panel, CaP 2), the GNSS ICD Capability Team (CaT) is to address the standardisation of the data Interface Control Documents (ICDs) associated with **open signals** GNSS receivers and systems.

### 3. TASK

3.1. Develop a detailed standard for the data Interface Control Documents associated with **open signals** GNSS Receivers.

3.2. Develop any additional recommendations required for the implementation of such GNSS ICD STANAG.

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# 4. DELIVERABLES

- Comprehensive NATO Standard for **open signals** GNSS data interfaces;
- Consolidated list of change proposals to existing NATO standards and Allied Publication as required;
- Technical notes and reports as required;

# 5. COMPOSITION

5.1. The GNSS ICD CaT is envisaged as a predominantly technical forum. It will benefit from the participation of representatives who are actively engaged in the development, procurement and integration of GNSS equipment and systems but also in their operational implementation and use.

5.2. The CaT shall comprise a national head of delegation from each participating nation who may be supported by other national participation providing technical/system expertise, military service operational expertise and industrial expertise.

5.3. A permanent Chairman will be elected from national nominations. The Nation whose candidate for chairmanship is successful may select another head of national delegation to replace him/her.

5.4. Representatives from the Strategic Commands, NHQC3S, NCIA and other NATO agencies, as appropriate.

5.5. The participation of Partner nations may be considered on a case by case basis, in accordance with the C3B Sub-structure Working Practices (Reference B).

5.6. National industry can attend when backed by a national CaT member or by NATO staff.

### 6. METHOD OF WORK

6.1. The CaT is subordinate to the C3B and CaP 2, receiving direction from and reporting directly to CaP 2. The lifetime of the group will not exceed three years to address this mandate. The CaT will develop a clear work plan during its first meeting to detail to organisation of work during its mandate. This work plan will be submitted to CaP 2 for agreement.

6.2. The CaT could convene up to 4 meetings per year for two to four days to discuss, review, evaluate and agree to changes, improvements and/or practices to ensure improved

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national and international interoperability practices for the NATO GNSS ICD standard development.

6.3. The role of the Chairman is detailed at Reference B, paragraph 14.

6.4. CaT meetings will be convened using a calling notice and their outcome captured. Calling Notices, Records, Agendas (if produced) and Notes submitted to cover CaT final deliverables will be NATO-referenced using a CaP 2 reference. Internal documentation and intermediate deliverables distributed within the CaT should use the website dedicated to the group (https://nhqc3s.hq.nato.int/Default.aspx).

6.5. During each meeting Action Items are presented to all Nations, some or an individual country to take action and report findings either before or at the next meeting for concurrence by the group.

6.6. Concurrence is completed by a single vote by participating NATO Nations before it is adopted.

6.7. A status report of all CaT activities will be submitted by the Chairman of the CaT, or their assigned delegate, at each CaP 2 meeting. Status reports and presentations shall clearly detail progress against the agreed work plan and identify any issues arising, including issues that are not within the scope of work of the group.
