 On February 14, 2018, I responded to Marjorie Stoneman Douglas High School, 5901 Pine Island Road, Parkland, Broward County, FL, in reference to a radio transmission from School Resource Deputy S. Peterson, advising there were shots being fired at the school. Upon arrival I heard what appeared to be five shots being fired. I responded into the school with other deputies and officers from the Coral Springs Police Department. There were several casualties as a result of the shooting.

On February 14, 2018, at approximately 2:45pm, I heard a radio transmission from Deputy S. Peterson, the School Resource Deputy at M.S. Douglas High School, of "shots fired" on the school campus. The school is located at 5901 Pine Island Road, Parkland, Broward County, Florida. I immediately responded from the district office to the north side of the school on Holmberg Road and arrived in less than one minute.

As I exited my vehicle, I heard approximately five guns shots that appeared to be coming from the area between buildings 12 and 13. I saw two students running east who were yelling, "active shooter!" I tried to gain information from them regarding the shooter but they continued running. I ran to the closest entry gate at the west end of the student parking lot and found that it was still locked. Another student was headed west with an adult who advised the student was shot in the leg. I told him to continue west to Deputy Marchese who was at West Glades Middle, just west of us. I used a key to open the lock and entered along with Deputy A. Perry. As we approached building 12, students were sporadically exiting the school. As I got closer to building 12, I immediately recognized [REDACTED] who was lying on his back, just outside the west doors to building 12. I did not hear any additional shots being fired at this point. Several Coral Springs Police Officers came up behind me and we advanced toward the building. As I scanned the school to the south for the shooter and provided cover, the other deputies and CSPD officers approached building 12. I saw an officer check [REDACTED] for a pulse and say he was deceased. The officer and Deputy Volpe entered building 12 and came back out with [REDACTED] who had been injured. [REDACTED] was placed on a golf cart and was removed from the area. I attempted to enter building 12 from the west but was confronted by several law enforcement officers who had entered from the east end of the building. To mitigate a crossfire situation, I exited the building and continued to hold cover to the south while the other deputies and officers worked to clear the building and treat the injured. I also checked [REDACTED] for vital signs and found he had no pulse and was not breathing. He appeared to have an injury to the back of his head. The injured students were removed from the east end of the building. There were no students exiting classrooms to the south as the school was in lockdown. I did not see the suspect and did not have any suspect description at that time.

Once SWAT units arrived and began to clear the buildings to the south, I assisted at the Tactical Operations Center providing intelligence to the incident command regarding the school, the city, and the district. I expanded the perimeter east to university drive, west to Coral Ridge Drive, south to the Sawgrass Expressway and north to Holmberg Road. I further assisted with evacuating the students from the school. Once additional Broward Sheriff's Office assets arrived, I was relieved of my duties.

On February 14, 2018, I responded to Stoneman Douglas high school, which is located at 5901 Pine Island Rd, in reference to a shooting in progress. I responded to the north side of the school and ran up to the east side of building 12 (which I believe is called the freshman building). Upon my arrival, I met with other Officers/Deputies and upon looking inside the doors I could see smoke in the air and victims on the ground. We immediately made entry into the building and began to search the first floor going from east to west.

As we searched the first floor, we located victims who were shot and they were immediately evacuated out of the building while we continued our search for more victims and the suspect. After completing the search of the first floor from east to west, I went up the west side stair case to the second floor where I was informed other officers/Deputies were now searching.

I then went to the third floor with another Deputy and I observed 3 victims laying on the ground. Two were towards the middle and one was on the complete opposite side (east side) of us. The victim on the opposite side of us was now attempting to lift his arm. Deputy S. Gonzalez, Deputy T. Garcia, and I immediately went to get the victims. We went to the victim and brought him back to the west side stair case where he was evacuated out of the building. The other two victims were deceased. We then started to search the third floor starting from the west side stair case towards the east side stair case for addition victims and for the suspect. As we went any victims located were evacuated out as fast as possible.

I then responded down stairs and went to the building just to the west of building 12 where I assisted other students who were being evacuated out of the building to the staging areas. Bwc in use.

On 2/14/18 I responded to 5901 Pine Island Rd (Marjory Stoneman Douglas High School) in reference to shots being fired inside a building within the school grounds. [REDACTED]

[REDACTED] Other officers/deputies arrived before I did.

Upon my arrival I stopped on the north side of the school. I did not know which building this was occurring. I took a cover position behind my patrol car in order to quickly assess the situation and see if I could determine where on the school grounds this was happening because I did not hear any shots being fired. Within approximately thirty seconds I could see several Coral Springs police officers and a Broward Sheriff's Office deputy running across the parking lot. Figuring that they knew which building to go to, I immediately ran to catch up to them.

I caught up to the officers and together we approached the west door of building twelve. I do not remember the exact count, but there were approximately five Coral Springs officers and a BSO deputy (Deputy Gerry Volpe #13562). One of the victims (later identified as [REDACTED]) was lying on his back to the right (south) of the door. He had been shot and appeared to be deceased. Two Coral Springs police officers entered the door first and immediately dragged out an injured person that was just inside the door. The Coral Springs officers and I then entered the west door of building twelve.

Upon entering the door I could see all the way down the hallway to the east door. There appeared to be bodies lying on the floor at the other end of the hall. I could also see other officers (unknown agency) entering the building through the east door. While I and the Coral Springs officers were inside, Deputy Volpe remained outside. I later learned that he assisted the injured person that had been dragged outside. See Deputy Volpe's supplement report detailing his actions.

We began the task of clearing the rooms in our immediate area on the west side of the first floor. We found an adult woman hiding in a locked office on the north side of that area. Wanting to avoid a potential crossfire situation with the officers that entered the east end, and coupled with the need to get officers/deputies to the upper floors as quickly as possible, we made our way to the second floor via the stairwell and continued to clear rooms. Some windows had to be shattered in order to gain entry into some of the locked classrooms where students and faculty were found to be hiding. No one was allowed outside the classrooms at this time until it was determined that all floors were secured. Two bullet shell casings were observed in the hallway about midway between both ends.

BSO SWAT arrived while we were clearing the second floor. I remained on the second floor with some of the Coral Springs officers until BSO SWAT gave the all-clear to start evacuating people. Classroom by classroom students and faculty were told to leave their belongings behind and file out per instructions. After everyone was evacuated, BSO SWAT forced entry into two utility rooms that we were unable to gain access to. BSO Bomb Squad also arrived to handle a lone backpack left in a second floor bathroom.

After injured had been removed and all others evacuated and the building was found to be secure, I walked out through the same west door that I had previously entered with the Coral Springs police officers. As I walked out the door I could see the body of [REDACTED] to my left (south of door) and an unidentified girl to my right (north side of door). Both were deceased.

I remained at my post keeping track of the crime scene log until approximately 9:30 P.M. when I was relieved by Deputy Mark Delio #15768.

Douglas High 1701 Zone

On February 14, 2018 at approximately 14:25 hours, I'm a School Resource Deputy at Riverglades Elementary, 7400 Parkside Drive, Parkland Florida. I was in my office after school dismissal when I heard Douglas High SRO Scot Peterson scream "shots fired" on his campus. I immediately responded to Douglas High campus.

Upon arrival I parked in the center median of the northwest entrance of the north student parking lot. I went to my trunk and removed my Broward Sheriff's Office Rock River Arms Patrol Rifle model LAR-15 serial number 90656. I changed the rifles status from ammo ready to threat ready. At this time I saw Broward Sheriff's Deputies Goolsby, Hanks and unknown city police officers moving south through the north parking lot towards the school campus. I joined several law enforcement officers working my way towards the 1200 building. As I approached the west door 1200 building I observed a w/m victim lying just south of the door on the ground. I personally knew the victim, he is [REDACTED] he was lying on his back and he was not moving. Upon reaching [REDACTED] I determined he was deceased. At this time an unknown Coral Springs Police Officer had pulled up to the west door of the 1200 building on a golf cart. I met with other unknown Coral Springs Officers who were extracting another w/m victim personally known to me, he is [REDACTED]. We assisted [REDACTED] onto the back of the cart, the Coral Springs Officer and I drove him to the intersection of Pine Island Rd. and Holmberg Rd. Upon arrival at the Coral Springs Fire/Rescue staging area the paramedics took [REDACTED] for treatment. [REDACTED] during the transport needed to be supported. I leaned over the seat and I grabbed onto [REDACTED] and held him until we arrived. During the transport I spoke to [REDACTED] but he did not respond back, during my conversation I only gave him words of encouragement that he was going to survive.

We returned to the 1200 building and we were directed to the east side of the building. Upon arrival I saw several city police officers extracting the wounded students and I assisted them with the extracting the victims. Deputy Carbocci replaced me as the second Deputy on the cart. I joined up with unknown Broward Sheriff's Deputies and city police officers we conducted a search of the first floor of the 1200 building. We searched for the suspect, we moved from the east to the west on the first floor until we reached the end of the building. We passed some locked doors that appeared to be bathrooms and it was unknown if they were occupied. A city officer checked the pockets of [REDACTED] and retrieved a set of keys from his pants pocket. I looked at the keys since I'm familiar with [REDACTED] and these keys appeared to be his personal keys. I then assisted other Deputies and Officers going west to east on the first floor completing a secondary search for victims, and no living victims were found. I exited the building after reports of a suspect may have exited the building and could be leaving the campus. Three unknown officers and I went westbound moving along a building past the basketball courts and continued southeast. As we were walking southeast I observed a school golf cart that had its left wheel buried in the dirt somewhere by the baseball field. Upon reaching the southeast portion of the school by the canal that borders the school we needed to stop to replace a police canine. I met up with Deputy Yurchuck and he provided me with paper towels to clean the blood on my arms that I received from the victims extraction.

When the city canine arrived we continued searching down the canal bank towards Westglades Middle. Upon reaching the end of the canal at Westglades Middle it was reported that the subject was taken into custody. I returned to my patrol unit and secured my patrol rifle. I then went to the intersection of Pine Island and Holmberg Rd and Coral Springs Fire Rescue assisted me with the cleaning of my arms removing the residual blood stains. I then assisted other

Deputies and city officers in crowd control at the northwest corner of Pine Island and Holmberg Rd.

I was contacted by my SRO Supervisor Sgt. Molamphy and he asked me to respond to the Broward Sheriff's Office Mobile Crime Scene Unit inside the school. Two Broward Crime Scene Detectives processed me at the scene. One Detective took photographs of myself in uniform, the blood stained areas of my uniform, bloodstains on the patrol rifle, blood stains on my fitbit watch and the Douglas High Security golf cart that transported the victims. Then a Detective took swabs of suspected blood from my uniform, the patrol rifle, fitbit watch, and the security golf cart. I was then released from the scene. No further action taken.

On 02/14/18 I responded from the City of Tamarac to the Marjory Stoneman Douglas High school in reference to the School resource Deputy asking for assistance due to him hearing the sounds of gunshots or fire crackers somewhere on the campus.

Due to the heavy flow of radio traffic following that transmission, I did not advise I was responding there and just simply showed up in case it was an active shooter. Deputy Valdes, who was traveling in a separate vehicle arrived at the North end of the School the same time I did. Due to me traveling to [REDACTED] to turn in paper work, I was dressed down and was not wearing full duty gear. I immediately put on my tac vest, activated my body worn camera, grabbed my rifle and ran toward the east door of building 12 along with Dep. Valdes and several Coral Springs Officers. I entered building 12 and immediately detected the odor of gun powder and observed several people lying in the hall way in pools of blood. Dep. Valdes, several Coral Springs Officers and I began to search the stairwell and several classrooms for the shooter. Dep Valdes and I moved approximately 3 or 4 people who were lying in the hallway to the outside and handed them over to several Deputies, who used a golf cart to transport them. While doing this my body camera was accidentally turned off by the handle of my rifle pressing against the camera on/off button. I returned inside the building and assisted several Coral Springs Officers clearing every class room on the first floor of building 12 in search of the shooter and escorting multiple students and teachers from several of the class rooms. After clearing the class rooms, I noticed that my body camera was not on and turned it back on. I held the west stairwell leading to the second floor until the BSO SWAT team arrived. I later exited the building and assisted with securing the outer perimeter of the crime scene until 0630 the following day. This concluded my involvement with this case. BWC.

On 2/14/18, I responded to 5901 Pine Island Road (Stoneman Douglas High School) in reference to a report of shots fired. This call came via the School Resource Deputy Peterson (via police radio).

As I was traveling east on Holmberg Rd now in the general area of the center to eastern portion of the Stoneman Douglas High School football field, I observed several frantic students running west along the chain linked fence that separates the roadway (Holmberg Road) from the football field trying to get my attention. I stopped in an attempt to gather information to pass along to other units. They advised that they were not sure if it was gun shots or fireworks. They did not see a gunman and were not exactly sure where it was coming from but did point east in the general direction of the north side of the school. I told the students to continue running west along the fence towards West Glades Middle School.

I then heard 4-5 very loud gunshots coming from what sounded like it was outside in the general area of the football field (east end) between me and where the other units were located to the east of me. I took cover behind my marked unit (4679) and scanned for a gunman but was unable to locate one. As I looked back, I observed several vehicles to include school buses (unknown occupants) approaching my location east bound. I stopped the vehicles to prevent them from entering the area from where the gun shots were heard.

I then had a student approach me from the opposite side of the chain linked fence who was accompanied by an adult who appeared to be school staff. The student had a gunshot wound to his leg but was still able to walk. Due to the gunshots I had just heard to the east of me, I told them to continue west towards West Glades Middle School.

To keep all of the motorists that were stopped behind me out of danger, they were turned around to head west bound. The east bound lane was now clear.

No additional gun shots were heard since the 4-5 gunshots heard earlier.

At about this time, I was approached by a school employee. He advised me that the subject was ID'd in the video surveillance to be Nikolas Cruz and that he was known to him as he was a prior student. I did pass that information along via the radio.

Students that were still walking west were being told to continue west in the direction of the middle school until it was learned that the subject was in custody in Coral Springs.

A short time later, additional units were requested at Holmberg Road and University Drive to assist with crowd control due to parents now starting to gather. I responded to that location and assisted with crowd control and traffic control.

On February 14, 2018, I heard via the BSO Radio that there were shots fired at Stoneman Douglas High School. While responding, Resource Deputy Peterson was attempting to establish a perimeter. Upon arrival I stopped my marked unit to prevent vehicular traffic from traveling Westbound by the school. I heard what appeared to be gun shots from the Westside of the school towards the football field and observed deputies immediately approaching the school on the Westside.

As on scene supervisor, I attempted to obtain additional resources and requested BSO K-9, helicopter, SWAT and additional support. Coral Springs Police Department arrived almost immediately and I directed them to the East entrance of the structure and advised them that BSO units had entered the Westside. Coral Springs officers asked if they could cut the chain on the East exit gate on Holmberg and they made entry into school property. BSO K-9 arrived on scene at my location and stood by in case he was needed to be deployed.

We established a command post on Pine island Road South of the school, where Captain Jordan assumed on scene command. Areas were established for additional law enforcement response and Fire and Rescue response.

At approximately 1541 hours, a suspect was stopped and detained and a witness was requested to identify the suspect. The location was 11735 NW 47th Drive, Coral Springs, at 1546 hours Sergeant Rossman and I transported a witness who was [REDACTED]. [REDACTED] made a positive identification of Suspect Cruz at 1555 hours. Please refer to Sergeant Rossman's report for further details of the identification.

On Wednesday, February 14th, 2018, I responded to 5901 Pine Island RD (Marjory Stoneman Douglas High school) reference to an active shooter at the high school.

After arriving scene, I took a perimeter on the east side of the school, after being instructed to do so due to the fact that BSO SWAT was inside the building actively searching for the suspect. I then observed a male victim that was laying down by the east gate with multiple gunshot wounds. I ran over to the intersection and advised Coral Springs Fire Rescue that there was a victim nearby with multiple shot wounds. I then ran back and escorted Fire Rescue to the victim. I then put on gloves, and applied pressure on one of the wound. Coral Springs Fire Rescue then picked up the victim put him on the stretcher and transported him to the hospital.

A short time later, word came on my BSO issued radio that the suspect was moving from inside the building on the second floor, which was directly across from my position. I made the decision to clear the street, and moved all the parents back to a safe place in case the suspect starts shooting from the building. Other deputies and I, walked the street and asked the parents to evacuate, and leave their cars behind.

I then took a position on the east side gate, and helped guided the kids to a safe place, which were still inside the school. A short time later, I responded to the Marriott Hotel and took a position at the south door. I stayed at the Marriott Hotel until 2130hrs.

On Wednesday February 14th 2018 I was at Dollar General located at 1337 S. Dixie Hwy in the City of Deerfield Beach when a call was dispatched regarding an active shooter in the City Of Parkland. The initial call was for Deputies with long guns only so I did not respond immediately. Several minutes later all free Deputies were requested and at that time I started for Marjory Stoneman Douglas High School in Parkland with lights and sirens activated.

When I arrived in the area having exited the Sawgrass Expressway at Coral Ridge Drive I proceeded north until I arrived at Holmberg Road and then proceeded east until reaching the school.

Once on the north side of the school I observed students running toward me as I was on Holmberg Rd. I directed those students to come to me and once they did I instructed them to get behind vehicles. Once behind the vehicles those students were checked by other Deputies with none found to be injured. During my time at the north side of the school I did not hear any gunfire.

Moments later it was dispatched that it was possible that the shooter had left the school in a westward direction and possibly toward the Walmart store located on Coral Ridge Dr. I then left my position and headed in that direction and toward the Walmart. Shortly after arriving there it was then dispatched that the shooter was possibly in custody near West View Rd and well south of my new location.

I then stayed at my new location at the intersection of Holmberg and Coral Ridge where I prevented any non law enforcement traffic from entering the area of the school and assisted in directing traffic. I stayed there until approximately 2030 hours until I was told I could leave.
